6 UPDATE FROM DORSET COUNCIL

6.1 West Bay Beach Wheelchair Scheme

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- The scheme that enables wheelchair users to access the beach has been secured.
 It is in its early stages, but booking for the specially designed wheelchairs will be online. The scheme is a partnership of Bridport TC, DC and Parkdean Resorts, Encompass Care have recently joined.
- 6.2 Wild Camping at Abbotsbury and West Bexington
 - Wild camping has started already. I note that a report of the activity was made under the PSPO a West Bexington resident. I will be contacting the appropriate DC officer to try to ensure that some enforcement takes place, and we are not left without as in previous years.
- 6.3 Clean Energy Vision
 - DC have written to The Crown Estate and the National Energy System Operator urging support for clean energy proposals within Dorset. This would bring in investment and new jobs.
 - Dorset's unique geology, deep-water port at Portland, and history of energy production including Winfrith make it an ideal location. The area is wellpositioned to support offshore wind, carbon capture and storage, hydrogen technologies, and other future energy innovations.
- 6.4 Shaping the Future of Housing Allocations in Dorset
 - DC has launched a 12 week consultation looking at how people are prioritised for the housing register. The feedback will help update the allocation policy for the next 5 years. This effects our most vulnerable residents.
 - Help shape the future of housing allocations in Dorset. Dorset Council
 - PSPO extended by 3 years

9 NEIGHBOUROOD PLAN

Brian Bowsher

- The Neighbourhood Plan has continued to be busy. I gave an update at the Annual Parish Assembly on 29th May so have somewhat less to report this evening.
- We had a SG meeting on 22nd May and a couple more meetings in the month to consider the draft policies in the Plan and hence identify questions for the community survey where we need further evidence.
- The main issues are as follows.
- Finance Update
 - The next grant funding window with Locality should open in the next few weeks. We've started to prepare a proposal based on the final tranche of funding from the Initial Grant (£4,658) and are in discussion with Amy Burnett about her work. We envisage her main tasks as preparing the first full draft of the Plan, preparing the Basic Conditions Statement, and more general consultancy support.
- Youth Event

May

- We held a Youth Focus Group in the Village Hall on 27th May to listen to and understand the views of some of the youth of the parish on the future of our villages. Thirteen people attended the event including 8 children/young people aged between 9 and 20. It was a successful event with the youngsters sharing their views on things they liked and what could be improved in the parish. Some of the main conclusions were:
- Desire for more youth-based activities in the parish.
- Appreciation of the history and heritage of the area and its rural and coastal environment.
- Concern about the dangerous roads and lack of pavements.
- Wish for housing that would attract more youngsters to the parish.
- The attendees produced a mind map and other feedback that should be valuable in crafting a Youth Survey which we anticipate will go to all the youngsters in the parish in the summer.
